2. RECOMMENDED ACTION ON RESOLUTION #18-15

The TC will be asked for its recommendation to the BRTB on Resolution #18-15. This resolution involves written provisions for cooperatively developing and sharing information related to transportation performance data, the selection of performance targets, the reporting of performance targets, and the reporting of performance to be used in tracking progress toward attainment of critical outcomes for the region, and the collection of data for the state asset management plan for the National Highway System by May 20, 2018. www.baltometro.org/BRTB/BRTBRes18-15.pdf

3. RECOMMENDED ACTION ON RESOLUTION #18-16

The TC will be asked for its recommendation to the BRTB on Resolution #18-16. This involves the adoption of two performance targets related to the CMAQ program for the Baltimore urbanized area. The targets are: (1) annual hours of peak-hour excessive delay per capita and (2) percent of non-SOV travel. Per federal requirements these targets for the Baltimore urbanized area will be the same for both the state and the region. The due date for the unified targets is May 20, 2018.
