## Background

- Regional Bicycle Facilities Inventory (RBFI) began in 2016 after BPAG vote
- Updated annually
- Includes all bicycle and shared-use facilities that are:
  - Existing
  - Under construction
  - Programmed
  - Planned
- Existing bicycle and shared-use facilities are available to <u>view here</u> and <u>download here</u>

### **RBFI Schema Update**

- BMC coordinated extensively with MDOT and member jurisdictions to develop new schema
- Goals
  - Incorporate more bicycle facility types
  - Align with MDOT SHA schema for statewide existing bicycle facility inventory and Level of Traffic Stress (LTS) analysis
  - Simplify annual update process for member jurisdictions

### • 2023 Update Underway

- Member jurisdictions contacted
- Updated datasets requested by May 19
- BMC will review submitted data for completeness and accuracy
- Updated RBFI will be sent to member jurisdictions, incorporated into BMC maps and web apps and submitted to MDOT SHA to incorporate into state bicycle facilities inventory





### **Existing RBFI Schema**

Current facility type categorization:

- 1. Bike lane
- 2. Separated bike lane
- 3. Signed designated bike route
- 4. Sharrows or marked shared lane
- 5. Shared-use path or transportation trail

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### **Bicycle Facility Subtype Examples**

#### **FACILITY SUBTYPE**

#### **EXAMPLE**

#### Sidepath

A separated path for non-motorized users which runs adjacent to roadways within the roadway rightof-way.



#### **Multi-use Trail**

A separated path for non-motorized users which is located outside the roadway right-of-way.







# **Bicycle Facility Subtype Examples**

#### FACILITY SUBTYPE

#### EXAMPLE

#### **Protected Bike Lane**

A portion of the roadway that has been designated for preferential or exclusive use by bicycles, allows one-way travel and is vertically separated from motor vehicle traffic. Examples of vertical separation include flexible delineator posts (plastic posts), bollards, concrete curbs, planters, concrete barriers, parking stops, raised bumps, parked cars and more.

#### **Buffered Bike Lane**

A dedicated bicycle lane separated from the adjacent motor vehicle travel lane(s) by a designated buffer space separating the bicycle lane from the adjacent motor vehicle travel lane. A buffered bicycle lane does not include vertical separation. Buffers should be a minimum of 18 inches wide, however, a width of at least 3 feet is preferred.
