# **Maryland Transportation Plan (MTP)**

### MDOT is developing the 2050 MTP – due by January 2024.

- Federal/state requirement
- 20-year long range transportation plan (updated every 5-years) through a public participation process to address current and future challenges.
- Is a policy-based long-range plan (vs. a project-based plan).
- Guides statewide policy and transportation investment decisions.
- The Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan is also being updated at the same time (per state statute).



### What is the State Report on Transportation?

The MDOT State Report on Transportation is a State legislatively required annual report on transportation, submitted each year on the third Wednesday in January to the Maryland General Assembly. It contains three important documents: the Maryland Transportation Plan (MTP), the Consolidated Transportation Program (CTP), and the annual Attainment Report (AR) on Transportation System Performance.



### PLAN

The MTP is MDOT's long-range vision for transportation.

### **INVEST**

The CTP presents detailed listings and descriptions for the capital projects proposed for construction or development and evaluation.

### **EVALUATE**

The annual Attainment Report on Transportation System Performance evaluates and reports on the performance of Maryland's transportation system, focusing on the goals adopted in the MTP.

## **2050 MTP AR Advisory Committee**

- The Governor's Attainment Report Advisory Committee (ARAC) on Transportation Goals, Benchmarks and Indicators
  - is convened every 5 years when MDOT develops a new statewide long-range transportation plan (MTP).
  - <u>Purpose</u>: to advise MDOT on the selection of performance measures and targets to be included in the Annual Attainment Report on Transportation System Performance (AR)
- The ARAC will also be asked to weigh in on the 2050 MTP draft guiding principles, goals, and outcomes, as well as performance measures
- ARAC meetings are scheduled for: May 23, June 8, June 20 and July 11 (all virtually at 1 pm).

## Phase 1 MTP – Summer - Winter 2022

- Best Practice Assessment of Statewide Long-Range Transportation Plans
  - Similar state DOTs, Multimodal, IIJA Assessments, Online Dashboards, multimodal, etc.

### Plan Assessment

- Comparing all MDOT/MPO transportation plans (goals, objectives, strategies, performance measures, etc.)
- Link Plan goals and objectives to programming/performance, including highlighting key corridors, indicating region issues/needs
- Provide a summary of the IIJA and identify sections of the MTP that address IIJA requirements in the Appendix
- Create a user-friendly, engaging, and dynamic MTP with graphics, short MTP document, interactive website, interactive public comment tool, interactive maps, etc.

# **Maryland's Population**

- Population is densest in Central Maryland
- Marylanders are getting older and make up a higher percentage of the population in nonurban areas
- Outside of Baltimore City, the highest poverty rates are concentrated in Western Maryland and Eastern Shore
- Population is projected to grow +16.28% by 2050

## **Proposed Guiding Principles**

Guiding principles align stakeholder missions, values, and capabilities with the overall vision.



Equity: Integrate equity considerations in all aspects of transportation planning, programming, and operational processes.

**Resilience:** Improve the transportation system's ability to provide reliable service throughout natural weather events and man-made threats.

**Preservation:** Preserve the condition of the existing transportation system assets to provide safe and efficient movement.

**Modernization:** Transform the transportation system by using proven technological improvements and exploring innovative new ideas.



**Experience & Engagement:** Improve the experience of all transportation system users.

## **Proposed Goals**

Goals are broad statements with desired results that reflect the overall MDOT mission statement.



Safety and Security: Protect the safety and security of all residents, workers, and visitors.

System Quality: Deliver a reliable, high-quality transportation system.

**Environmental Stewardship:** *Minimize and mitigate environmental* impacts throughout the transportation system.

Serving Communities and the Economy: Expand transportation options to allow Maryland's diverse communities to access opportunities.



## Survey #2

- Survey #2 will be focusing on transportation needs, key outcomes of the 2050 MTP, and investment priorities
- Survey #2 anticipated in June 2023
  - Input on key outcomes
  - Identification of needs/priorities (on a map)
  - Coin/funding exercise of modal priorities/needs
- The AR Advisory Committee will provide guidance and advise related to the goals and the performance measures and indicators to reach those goals.



# Phase 3 MTP – Summer/Fall 2023

- Develop Draft Plan early to mid summer
- Release Draft Plan for Public Review late summer/early fall
  - Public engagement will include:
    - Webinar/survey(s)
    - Fall CTP County/City Tour meetings
    - FHWA/FTA review of draft
    - MPO review of draft
- Final Plan December/January
- Submit Final 2050 MTP with the State Report on Transportation
  - January 2024
