

2024-2027 TIP Amendment: I-695 / Francis Scott Key Bridge Rebuild

June 25, 2024





Reason for Amendment

- Add planning and construction dollars to FY 2025
- Funding needed in a subsequent phase for NEPA signature
- Team wanted coverage in the event we could begin demolition activities early





Background





March 23, 1977: 1.7 mile-long Key Bridge opened over the Patapsco River as part of 1-695



March 26, 2024: Cargo ship leaving the Port of Baltimore strikes the Key Bridge causing its collapse





Project Intent

- Clear the Ft McHenry Channel and fully reopen marine vessel traffic to the Port of Baltimore
- Remove unstable / dangerous debris from the River
- Remove remaining debris to prepare for bridge rebuild
- Rebuild the Key Bridge





Project Goals

- Restore functionality and transportation connectivity
- Revitalize surrounding areas
- Stimulate economic activity
- Attract investment and breathe new life into communities that are impacted by the bridge collapse





Rebuild Parameters

The new Key Bridge will:

- Be higher to accommodate taller ships entering the Port
- Be constructed in the same location on approximately the same alignment
- Stay primarily within the state's existing right-of-way
- Include four lanes (2 per direction) and shoulders
- Include larger pier protection in the water





Timeline

- April 2024: Initiate regular agency coordination
- May 2024: Restore use of Federal Channel
- June 2024: US Coast Guard Clearance Determination
- July 2024: NEPA approval (anticipated Categorical Exclusion)
- Sept to Dec 2024: Permits and Authorizations
- Fall 2024: Demolition of Remaining Structure
- January 2025 Begin Construction
