- New scales or upgrades to most of the TWIS

Truck Weigh & Inspection Station

- Sixteen sites throughout Maryland on major highways, bridges and tunnels
- Owned by State Highway and MDTA
- Operated by Maryland State Police & MDTA
- All sites have permanent scales, many have WIM
- Last year, conducted more than 80K inspections
- Last year, stations weighed more than 2M trucks
- Last year, Virtual Weigh stations weighed 21M

Why Virtual Weigh Stations?

STATE HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATION

- Virtual Weigh Stations can identify speed, height, and weight of each axle of a truck moving at highway speed – no need for the vehicle to stop
- Identify unsafe trucks and their companies
- Efficient use of law enforcement personnel
- Stop oversize/overweight loads on bypass roads
- Minimize damage to roads, bridges and tunnels from grossly over weight loads
- Prevent oversize/overweight load permit fraud
- Traffic management on state, county and other road arteries
- Quick deployment, low capital and operational costs

CHALLENGE

How do you move objects that are larger than the legal limits without:

harming the roads and bridges, or being a safety risk?



Maryland One Hauling Permits System



General Conditions for Movement of Oversize and Overweight Vehicles

11.04.02.03 Safety

The Permittee shall ensure the safety and rights of the public and be responsible for:

- adequate flag persons and escorts
- wide load or oversize load signs
- maintaining proper distance from another permit vehicle
- using the shortest practical route using the interstate and State routes to reduce travel on secondary highways.
- traveling during favorable road and weather conditions
- using warning flags during the day and warning lights at night

Height Surveys

Everything 14'6 or higher requires a height survey



FINES

24-112 (e)1 Persons violating SHA permit condition that allows oversized Vehicle on hwy:

24-112 (e)2 Persons <u>failing to obtain</u> and possess required permit before moving an oversize, overweight load:

1 st offense	\$1010.00
2 nd offense	\$1540.00
3 rd offense	\$2040.00

Maryland One E-Permits

- Maryland issued over 135,000 permits
- Generated over \$17,000,000 revenue
- Over 89% were issued automatically
- What used to take hours now takes minutes
- With accepted routes no engineering review is required

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2023 FMCSA ANALYSIS, RESEARCH, AND TECHNOLOGY FORUM

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Motor Carrier Safety Assistance Program (MCSAP)

- Lead MCSAP agency writes grants that include commercial vehicle inspections, traffic enforcement, terminal audits and outreach.
- Provide federal funding to 20+ enforcement agencies and monitors their performance
- Monitors Title VI compliance at state and local level.

Outreach/Education

- Outreach to the trucking industry can take the form of signs for regulation and weight enforcement.
- Printed media such as the Maryland Truckers' Map or Motor Carrier Handbook
- October 4th is the Maryland Safety Summit where speakers will provide information on a variety of safety topics.

Outreach/Education

- Since not all crashes are caused by the driver of the commercial vehicle, the general motoring public are provided messages to enhance safety.
- It is dangerous to tailgate trucks because forward visibility is limited
- It is dangerous when passing a truck to pull back in front of the truck without allowing for their longer stopping distance.
