2024 Opportunity Map

- Composite map factoring each indicator equally.
- Lightest purple: Median opportunity in region
- More concentrated advantage as purple gets darker
- More concentrated disadvantage as green gets darker





Resilience 2050 Environmental Justice Areas

- TAZs with non-white population above regional average (44.7%), OR population below 200% of poverty above regional average (21.4%)
- Majority of Region:
 - 54% of TAZs
 - 56% of population





Proposed Equity Emphasis Areas for Scenario Planning

- Two lowest opportunity quintiles (green) would be Equity Emphasis Areas for Scenario Planning
- Focused:
 - o 40% of census tracts
 - \circ 36% of population
- Would further coordinate transportation and housing planning in our metropolitan area.
- A key fair housing need in low-opportunity areas is infrastructure (e.g., transportation, parks, recreation, schools)
