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# Summary of Employment by Jurisdiction (Worker, Including self employed)

- Howard County has the highest share of workers who are currently employed (72.7%), followed by Carroll County (70.1%) and Anne Arundel County (68.9%).
- A somewhat smaller share of Baltimore County workers (64.7%) and Harford County workers (64.1%) are currently employed.
- A still smaller share of Baltimore City workers (59.7%) and Queen Anne's County workers (58.8%) are currently employed.





# Summary of Employment by Jurisdiction (Retired)

- Queen Anne's County has the highest share of workers who are currently Retired (37.6%), followed by Harford County (27.4%), Anne Arundel County (25.8%), Baltimore County (25.7%), and Carroll County (24.7%).
- A somewhat smaller share of Howard County workers (23.1%) and Baltimore City workers (21.7%) are currently retired.





# Summary of Employment by Jurisdiction (Unemployed)

- Baltimore City has the highest share of workers who are currently unemployed (6.7%), followed by Baltimore County (4.9%).
- A somewhat smaller share of Harford County workers (3.5%) and Carroll County workers (3.4%) are unemployed.
- A still smaller share of Anne Arundel County workers (3.2%) and Howard County workers (2.6%) are unemployed.
- The smallest share of unemployed workers are those in Queen Anne's County (1.2%).

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# Summary of Employment by Jurisdiction (Disabled non-Worker)

- Baltimore City has the highest share of disabled nonworkers (11.8%), followed by Harford County (5.0%).
- Baltimore County has a slightly smaller share of disabled non-workers 4.7%).
- Queen Anne's County (2.4%) and Anne Arundel County (2.1%) have still smaller shares of disabled non-workers.
- The smallest shares of disabled non-workers are those in Carroll County (1.8%) and Howard County (1.6%).





### **Employment by Age Group**



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### Summary of Employment by Age Group

- The largest share of those 16-17 years old are workers, including self employed (87.1%). Smaller shares are Unemployed (11.4%) and Disabled non-workers (1.4%). There are no Retired workers (0.0%) in this group.
- The largest share of those 18-44 years old are workers, including self employed (89.6%). Smaller shares are Unemployed (7.1%) and Disabled non-workers (3.0%). A very small share are Retired (0.3%).





## Summary of Employment by Age Group continued

- The largest share of those 45-64 years old are workers, including self employed (76.7%). Smaller shares are Retired (10.9%) and Disabled non-workers (8.2%). A still smaller share are unemployed (4.2%)
- The largest share of those 65 years old or older are Retired (73.3%). A smaller share are workers, including self employed (23.3%), and Disabled non-workers (2.6%). A still smaller share are unemployed (0.8%).





### **Employment by Race & Ethnicity**







# Summary of Employment by Race & Ethnicity

- The largest share of Whites are workers, including self employed (67.2%). Smaller shares are Retired (27.2%).
  Still smaller shares are Unemployed 2.9%) and Disabled non-workers (2.8%).
- The largest share of African Americans, Blacks are workers, including self employed (57.6%). Smaller shares are Retired (22.0%) and Disabled non-workers (12.7%). A still smaller share are Unemployed (7.6%).





# Summary of Employment by Race & Ethnicity continued

- The largest share of Asians are workers, including self employed (77.4%). Smaller shares are Retired (16.8%) and Unemployed (4.7%). A still smaller share are Disabled non-workers (1.1%).
- The largest share of Hispanics are workers, including self employed (83.8%). Smaller shares are Retired (9.1%) and Unemployed (5.6%). A still smaller share are Disabled non-workers (1.5%).





### **Employment Status: Daily Trips by Trip Purpose (%) (five categories)**

- The largest share of trips are trips to Work (41.0%).
- The second largest share of trips are for Shopping and Meals (26.2%).
- The third largest share of trips are for Personal Business and Other Tasks (25.7%).
- The fourth largest share of trips are for Socializing and Recreation (5.5%), and the fifth largest share of trips are for School (1.6%).
- The share of Daily Trips, in rank order, by trip purpose, is:
  - Work (41.0%)
  - · Shop/Meal (26.2%)
  - Personal Business/Other(25.7%)
  - Social/Recreation (5.5%)
  - School (1.6%)

- The second largest share of trips are for Personal Business and Other Tasks (36.4%)
- The third largest share of trips are for Socializing and Recreation (10.0%)
- The fourth largest share of trips are for Work (1.7%), and the fifth largest share of trips are for School (0.4%).
- The share of Daily Trips, in rank order, by trip purpose, is:
  - Shop/Meal (51.5%)
  - Personal Business/Other (36.4%)
  - Social/Recreation (10.0%)
  - Work (1.7 %)
  - School (0.4%)
