 - Providing incident details to the TMC







SAFETY BENEFITS OF CHART PROGRAM

In 2022:

- 1,084 crashes on Maryland interstates did not occur due to CHART operations
- 472 secondary crashes did not occur due to CHART operations
- 41 million vehicle-hours of reduced delay due to CHART operations

EQUIPMENT/TRAINING UPGRADES

Automated External Defibrillators

- 60 devices were deployed on SHA CHART and ITS vehicles.
- 100 personnel were trained in Basic First Aid, CPR & AED
- ZOLL AED plus model

DEBRIS REMOVAL PROJECT

Coordinated project with University of Maryland, Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering.

- Grant funding to conduct research
- 2 LaneBlade systems purchased and placed inservice on two supervisor vehicles.
- Report completed showing value of devices
- OTMO has applied for innovation grant funding to enhance vehicle capability and outfit 30 of 84 vehicles with debris removal system.

Overall, the system improves safety for responders and road users, enhances traffic flow, and reduces exposure to traffic hazards.



MARYLAND STATE POLICE TIM SECTION

MSP created the TIM unit in 2021 to enhance speed and efficiency of MSP response to traffic crashes. Primarily work in SHA TOC 4 (Baltimore area).

- Completely funded by the MDOT State Highway Administration.
- 6 Troopers and 5 decentralized motorcycle units.
- Nationally Certified TIMS responders and Instructors.
- Primarily use police motorcycles and conduct both Basic and Instructor schools annually.
- Have responded to all major traffic events since inception.
- Total activity:
 - Coordináted and led 292 dignitary escorts.
 - Conducted 5,480 traffic stops leading to 12,253 citations and warnings and 45 arrests.





EASTERN SHORE TRAFFIC OPERATIONS (ESTO)

- Began May 17, and ends October 5, 2024
- Fridays, Saturdays, Sundays, Independence Day and Monday Holidays
- 0800 until 2000 hours or delays relieved, will bolster Safety Service and MSP patrols of beach corridors
- Focused patrols "Reach the Beach Routes Bay Bridge, US 50, US 301, MD 90, and MD 404.


EASTERN SHORE TRAFFIC OPERATIONS (ESTO) US 50 RAMP MANAGEMENT SPECIAL EVENT

- This program began Friday, May 17th and ends on Sunday, September 1st.
- Closures will be manned by SHA and law enforcement.
- Anne Arundel County
 - Ramp from Oceanic Drive to east bound US 50 will be closed to traffic beginning 10 am Fridays to 6pm Saturdays.
- Queen Anne's County
 - Ramp from MD 8 to west bound US 50 and Duke Street ramp to US 50 west will be closed to traffic. Ramps will be closed weekly on Saturdays and Sundays between 12pm and 6pm, as well as holiday Mondays.




TRAFFIC INCIDENT MANAGEMENT TRAINING PROGRAM





STRUCK-BY'S

The Emergency Responder Safety Institute has launched a new nationwide database to collect detailed information about incidents on the roadway where emergency responders or their equipment were struck by a vehicle while operating at a scene.

Available at ReportStruckBy.com using the ResponderSafety.com platform, the database accepts reports from all roadway responders, including fire, law enforcement, EMS, fire police and special traffic units, safety service and freeway service patrols, departments of transportation, public

works, and towing and recovery.



The goal is to improve the voluntary reporting, tracking, and analysis of struck-by incident data to prevent future incidents.
