EVACUATION TTX OBJECTIVES

- Evaluate the ability of regional partners to execute an integrated, coordinated, and collaborative multi-jurisdictional mass evacuation necessitated by a natural disaster enhanced by the effects of climatechange.
- 2. Evaluate the ability of regional partners to ensure that the unique needs of vulnerable populations (including, but not limited to populations in poverty, functional disabilities, elderly, non-English speaking, and/or households with no personal vehicle) are properly accommodated during an event that necessitates a multi-jurisdictional mass evacuation.

- 3. Resolve coordination vs command and control question (Rec. 1.7)
- 4. Invite staff from NCR/MWCOG/DCHSEMA to discuss opportunities to operationalize coordination and best practice sharing for evacuation planning (working with PIO, EM, and Evac WG) (Rec. 1.8)
- 5. Coordinate with Region III Health and Medical Coalition to discuss evacuation coordination from major hospital systems (Rec. 2.6)

Disaster Debris Planning Task Force

- Maryland DGS working to incorporate local procurement requirements from FEMA in the next procurement to enable local jurisdictions to get reimbursed if the local uses a state contract. New contracts should be in place in mid-2024.
