Main p	point of discussion was to share information on COVID19 operations, disruptions and supply chain
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a.	Debbie opened with updating school decisions that appear to be falling on the side of
	virtual teaching for the Fall and perhaps through December. They are having challenges
	with social distancing and teachers do not want to return at this time. Challenges
	remain in a virtual environment for communities that do not have wifi, special
	education students that need face-to-face learning, students that depend on schools for
	a meal, and the K-Gr5 students that learn better with face-to-face.
b.	Brian shared that they had a summer camper test positive for COVID and they have
	rehired a contractor to disinfect the summer camp environment. They are sourcing the
	Riobi fogger, and are heavily involved in reopening their small businesses safely.
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u.	Brandon said that they have no new PPE requirements, and they are working with their
	school district for some essential PPE supplies, such as gowns.
e.	Andrew shared that they are developing their long term sourcing solution and have
	hired temporary staffing to evaluate their action to ensure FEMA compliance and
